August's Newsletter Summary

I am currently on restricted duties due to injury, my work this month has been from an admin perspective, answering emails, taking calls speaking and liaising with partners, businesses and residents.

Referrals and Support

- St Mungo's have been liaised with around rough sleepers, tents in Druitt Gardens were deemed abandoned belongings. Some site checks were carried out to engage with a rough sleeper yet was not

located. CSAS colleagues assisted with this.

- Some of the services I have engaged with this month have been as well as liaising with Christchurch Town Council, Christchurch Neighbourhood Police Team, Dorset Police Safer Schools Officer, Dorset Police Crime Prevention Design Advisor, BCP Christchurch Anti-Social Behaviour Officer, BCP Young Person's Anti-Social Behaviour Officer, Parks and Countryside team, Sovereign Network Group and Adult Social Care.

ASB/Incidents/Outcomes

- There have been reports of suspected drug use in green spaces and alcohol consumption. Some reports are linked to young adults and young persons. Work continues with partners in identifying individuals who have caused anti-social behaviour and criminal activity.
- There was concern highlighted by a resident around bird feeding in Saxon Square, this causes concern as it can attract rats and other pests, the person reporting has been signposted to report online to BCP Environmental Protection – report of rats and other pests on private land.
- There has been reports at two hot spot locations of young persons lighting fires, defecating, graffiti to trees, fly-tipping, littering, den building and using resident's garden furniture that have been taken from their property, noise related anti-social behaviour and reported criminality. Work is on-going with the relevant agencies. Dorset Police's Crime Prevention Design Officer will be doing 2 walkarounds at the sites during September with other agencies/partners. This is to look at ways to mitigate ASB/crime with an aim to prevent and reduce re-occurrence.
- I have liaised with Dorset Police/BCP Licensing team around a business of concern, I have updated the Neighbourhood Police Team.
- There was a report of young persons climbing on the canopy of the train station. If you see individuals at height please call 999.
- Tents that appeared at Quomps and abandoned were cleared by parks following reports
- Beryl launched E-Scooter Scheme in Christchurch
- **Public Spaces Protection Order (PSPO)**
An alcohol Consumption PSPO for BCP area was brought in under section 59 to 65 of the Anti-Social Behaviour, Crime and Policing Act 2014. For BCP this is extended to 30 June 2027. It gives authorised officers and Dorset Police the ability to address alcohol related ASB. The PSPO is not an alcohol ban, and it does not make it an offence to drink alcohol in the area covered by the order. However, it would be an offence to fail to comply with a request from an authorised officer to cease drinking or surrender alcohol in the area covered by the Order if the individual is or is likely to cause anti-social behaviour. If alcohol is confiscated, it can be disposed of by the person who confiscates it. It is an offence to fail to comply with a request by an authorised officer to cease drinking or surrender alcohol in the controlled drinking area. Failure to comply could lead to a fine or prosecution.
- As always, we continue taking a joint approach with our ASB team and Support Services. Behaviours are being managed through civil interventions and holistic support and will progress where evidence suggests and where appropriate further action warrants.
 - I continue to receive community intelligence; this is so valuable to the community in trying to reduce crime and anti-social behaviour.
