**October Newsletter Summary.**

**Referrals and Support**

- CSAS engaged with a rough sleeper who is engaging well with support services.
- Some of the services and businesses I have engaged with this month have been Christchurch Town Council, Christchurch Neighbourhood Police Team, BCP Christchurch Anti-Social Behaviour Officer, BCP Young Person's Anti-Social Behaviour Officer, Environmental Protection, Parks and Countryside team.
- A suicidal male received support from a local business and spoke with the relevant services

**ASB/Incidents/Outcomes**

- **High Street** – reports of youths on roofs which was reported to the police by the business. Police are aware of the trespass, last month there was also reports of youths on roofs and criminal damage, again this was reported to police by the business.
- **Civic Offices** -Youth ASB and Criminal Damage – reported to police and ASB team. Youths identified and early intervention carried out by the Youth ASB Officer. The criminal damage is a police matter.
- **Druitt Gardens** – Damage to green space from youths on electric bikes – concerns raised around the speed and damage. ASB report raised. Advised to also report to police. Individual captured on footage I will keep an eye out during patrols for the individuals and the bike used. This has also been shared with NPT Safer Schools Officer and Youth ASB Officer. The youth ASB Officer patrolled Druitt Gardens nil incidents reported during this time.
- **Christchurch Retail Park** – Patrols undertaken due to reports of youths causing issues in shops and in the car park. This is happening later in the day/evening, No anti-social behaviour was witnessed by myself and my colleague. The NPT PCSO's have regular Mobile Police Station engagements for residents to attend at this location.
- **Bailey Gardens and path parallel to Christchurch Retail Park** – Along the path children/youths were witnessed with garden spades digging ramps. The Youth ASB Officer also witnessed this which resulted in a call to parents and their attendance at the location. Bailey Gardens has been clear of individuals on my patrols. The area is clear of litter, although graffiti remains on trees. We will continue to carry out targeted patrols to this area. During another engagement with a youth group, they mentioned they go to this location. Positive engagement was had, and we advised them to spread the word around their friendship groups that targeted patrols are being carried out at hot spot locations. They were also advised around the impact ASB/Criminal activity has had on the community in this location recently.
- **Jumpers Cemetery, Endfield Playpark/Scout Hut, Jumpers Common Recreation Ground,** – This area has been targeted with patrols from CSAS and the Youth ASB Officer following reports of: large groups of under 18's, illegal use of moped on fields, suspicion of drug misuse and dealing, damage to trees, attempts at fire starting, loud music, shouting, swearing, intimidation of dog walkers, smashed glass, littering, graffiti, vandalism of park equipment, assault of a school child Residents encouraged to report criminal activity to the police and ASB to the ASB team. Some of this activity is also occurring in to the evening/early hours. We carried out targeted patrols and moved on a group of 15 years olds who were playing loud music and causing ASB. We engaged with the group and advised them of impact on the community and that the police/ASB/CSAS are aware of hot spot areas and patrols will increase.
- **St Catherine's hill** – reports of illegal use of motor bikes/quad bikes. Reported to police. Please report any incidents as the police as they occur. Identity of individuals has not been possible due to lack of evidence.
- **Rutland Road Play Park** – A multi-agency/partner approach to mitigating criminal damage and ASB has happened and improvements have already been reported. Patrols will continue.
- **Royal Close** - Please report any ASB in this location. It is the walk-through seated area. If you witness any incidents, please report to [asbteam@bpcouncil.gov.uk](mailto:asbteam@bpcouncil.gov.uk)
- **Saxon Square Car Park** – male moved on for begging. Police informed of a male making threats.
- Information received from a local business around a prolific thief. This has been reported to police. Words of advice given to the business. My foot patrols often help with deterring and preventing criminal activity.

- A local business has come to note as a concern, relevant partner agencies have been made aware.
- Public Spaces Protection Order (PSPO)
  - An alcohol Consumption PSPO for BCP area was brought in under section 59 to 65 of the Anti-Social Behaviour, Crime and Policing Act 2014. For BCP this is extended to 30 June 2027. It gives authorised officers and Dorset Police the ability to address alcohol related ASB. The PSPO is not an alcohol ban, and it does not make it an offence to drink alcohol in the area covered by the order. However, it would be an offence to fail to comply with a request from an authorised officer to cease drinking or surrender alcohol in the area covered by the Order if the individual is or is likely to cause anti-social behaviour. If alcohol is confiscated, it can be disposed of by the person who confiscates it. It is an offence to fail to comply with a request by an authorised officer to cease drinking or surrender alcohol in the controlled drinking area. Failure to comply could lead to a fine or prosecution.**
- As always, we continue taking a joint approach with our ASB team and Support Services. Behaviours are being managed through civil interventions and holistic support and will progress where evidence suggests and where appropriate further action warrants.
  - I continue to receive community intelligence; this is so valuable to the community in trying to reduce crime and anti-social behaviour.

- Part 3 in the series of the Looking After Project – Looking After Each Other will be held at Christchurch Library on Saturday 8<sup>th</sup> November 2025 10am – 3pm. We will have a guest speaker – Stuart Semple, International Artist, MIND Ambassador and mental health advocate. Stuart will give a talk at 12-12.15 and an activity for all ages 12.30-1.15. The event will be opened by the Town Crier, Christchurch Mayor will be attending, Victim Support, Christchurch Police, ASB Principal, CSAS, More Bus, Christchurch BID, Two Riversmeet, GP referral scheme, CAB, Live Well Dorset, Home Library Service and Lifeline amongst others. We look forward to seeing you.
