## November Newsletter Summary

### Referrals and Support

- CSAS engaged with new individuals who are rough sleeping, seeing an increase in this. All support services are offered and referrals made if appropriate.
- Some of the services and organisations I have engaged with this month have been Christchurch Town Council, Christchurch Neighbourhood Police Team, BCP Christchurch Anti-Social Behaviour Officer, BCP Young Person's Anti-Social Behaviour Officer, White Ribbon – (VAWG – Violence Against Women and Girls), Dorset Police Safer Schools Officer, Twynham School, Homeless Health Service, We Are With You – (WAWY), ASC – Adult Social Care, St Mungo's, UKPAC- SentrySIS
- Liaised with police and support services around concern for welfare and vulnerable females.

### ASB/Incidents/Outcomes

- **Bargates** – Concerns raised from a business around an individual, information shared with police, reported to police and ASB team.
- **Civic Offices** – Report received around young persons being intimidating by loitering and possible drug concerns.
- **Saxon Square Car Park** – Young persons reported as spray painting offensive graffiti. Report of drug activity. Report of anti-social driving in car park. Reported to police and ASB team. Early Intervention Notice (EIN's) issued for ASB. Evidence gathered for begging.
- **High Street** – Reports of speeding electric bikes with youths wearing balaclavas. Report of safety concerns around e-scooters and no lights amongst unsafe usage. Assisted with informing police of a person of interest sighted. I carried out deter and prevent patrols in some shops who experienced shoplifting. I reported through direct to BCP smashed Totem signage in Pound Lane, some reports of other vandalism of the totems came in this was also reported. Unattended items observed by myself, I asked cameras to monitor whilst I waited a short while, when individuals returned words of advice given to leaving unattended items.
- **Barrack Road** – Young persons in balaclavas on electric bikes weaving in and out of traffic at speed. Police aware
- **Ducking Stool Lane** – various reports of young person's ASB – noise nuisance from skateboards, music, kicking doors, banging doors, vandalism. ASB team and police aware. Encouraged reporting to gather evidence.
- **Saxon Square Public Toilets** – liaised with BCP around some reported issues and improper and inappropriate use of facilities, concerns around drug dealing and drug taking. Police and ASB team aware.
- **Stanpit/Somerford** – Report of young persons targeting residential properties, banging, kicking doors, throwing eggs and plastic bottles. Advised around reporting to the ASB team and police, so evidence can be gathered.
- **Barrack Road Recreation Ground/Twynham School** – Targeted patrols carried out by myself and my colleague, engaged with young persons and explained my role in the community, positive interactions were had. Concerns around drug dealing on the recreation ground and concerns around young persons on electric bikes wearing balaclavas, (not seen by myself during visible presence, however seen at other locations such as High Street and Barrack Road). Engagement/support/deter/prevent process continues. Police/Safer Schools/ASB Officers aware.
- Public Spaces Protection Order (PSPO)
  - An alcohol Consumption PSPO for BCP area was brought in under section 59 to 65 of the Anti-Social Behaviour, Crime and Policing Act 2014. For BCP this is extended to 30 June 2027. It gives authorised officers and Dorset Police the ability to address alcohol related ASB. The PSPO is not an alcohol ban, and it does not make it an offence to drink alcohol in the area covered by the order. However, it would be an offence to fail to comply with a request from an authorised officer to cease drinking or surrender alcohol in the area covered by the Order if the individual is or is likely to cause anti-social behaviour. If alcohol is confiscated, it can be disposed of by the person who confiscates it. It is an offence to fail to comply with a request by an authorised officer to cease drinking or surrender alcohol in the controlled drinking area. Failure to comply could lead to a fine or prosecution.
- As always, we continue taking a joint approach with our ASB team and Support Services. Behaviours are being managed through civil interventions and holistic support and will progress where evidence suggests and where appropriate further action warrants.

- I continue to receive community intelligence; this is so valuable to the community in trying to reduce crime and anti-social behaviour.

#### **Legislation**

- 3 Early Intervention Notices were issued.

#### **Community Engagement**

- Part 3 in the series of the Looking After Project – Looking After Each Other was held at Christchurch Library on Saturday 8<sup>th</sup> November 2025. Thank you everyone who helped organise and take part on making the day a huge success.
- Christmas Lights switch on – it was great to see those who attended for the official switch on.

#### **Business Engagement**

- I spent an afternoon with SWL – Dorset Crime Liaison Officer in explaining UKPAC – Sentrysis. This is a business communities secure crime management platform. We carried out approximately 18 business engagements in promoting the app to use in Christchurch via Christchurch BID.
